Andy teaches two URBDP courses here that are cross-listed with 25-30 students

There are a number of students who are interested in MPH and MUP concurrent

You would complete both degrees in 3 years with a shared thesis

Both degrees that meet all requirements

Jan: on MPH...There are three different degrees in Public Health? Most promising Env health and health services degrees

There is a lot of complimentary work between MUP and the Env Heal and health Services

Part of the proposal is you have to list out courses, which are in the proposal

Her role is director of MSRE and the interdisciplinary group individuals are vetted by the dean
students allowed to take interdisciplinary classes

- There is a plan to move from 72-66 credit hours for a degree
- Students are looking to create a Niche in the program
- Wants the program to be more international less local
- As far as hiring a new candidate, Sofia has done a lot to increase the pool of candidates
- Goal for new hires...its important to have lots of feedback

12 or 13 second years

74% acceptance rate and the goal is to lower that and increase the applicants

Half the students are currently local students ...would like to increase to broader students

There is a specialization program in RE but there is no certificate per se
