Assistant Teaching Professor discussion - open for comments from non-voting individuals

- W. Freitag Thank G. Keith Harris for his contributions to the MIMP program. Keith received high scores in student evaluations and was very popular and known in CBE. During the time he taught in the program he was great on his interactions with students even in a fully online environment.
- R. Freitag Thank G. Keith Harris for picking up courses. Heard extremely positive comments from students that took classes with Keith. Has only favorable comments about him, students like him and he was interested in how students were progressing.
- M. Herzog as the program manager for the CEP major, expressed support for hiring G.K. Harris, after attending his job talk and reviewing his materials is clear for her that Harris teaching philosophy is aligned with the values of the program, he has received stellar evaluations. Vouched his strengths as an educator.
- C. Bae Ask H. Herzog her assessment for Emrah Altinok M. Herzog Both are strong applicants, they could be great educators for CEP. but Keith' teaching philosophy and his ability to bring students into leadership roles and actively engage students in the classroom was more seen in Keith's materials than Emrah. Keith had more substantial evidence of course evaluations than Emrah, it was hard to compare.
- D. Stevenson Both candidates come from interdisciplinary backgrounds, distinctions: Emrah, collaborating in course design, this could be for CBE studio courses, teaching demonstration and teaching studio classes. Keith, design courses coming from his interdisciplinary background and the way he thinks about planning and environment. Can't speak to Keith's collaborations with other faculty members in the college but assume he has the skills set to do that.
